## **Minor in Korean Studies**

### Aims of Minor

The goal of the Minor in Korean Studies is to provide students with the effective communication skills in speaking, writing, reading, and listening comprehension in Korean, as well as provide familiarity with the principal cultural features of the Korean speaking world.

The minor provide students with Summer Internship Programme to encourage students to apply their academic training into professional practice in Korean global companies. (e,g, Samsung Hong Kong Ltd, Samsung Electronics Hong Kong Ltd., LG Electronics HK Co Ltd, Korean Air, Korea Exchange Bank, Shin Han Bank, Hana Bank, Woori Bank, etc.) In addition, students can participate in Summer Study Tour in reputable Korean language centres in universities/organizations in Korea to immerse themselves into the target language and culture context.

The Minor in Korean will be a useful complement to the course of studies of students engaged in a wide variety of disciplines (Economics & Finance, Asian & International Studies, Linguistics, Translation, Media, Communication, Political Science, East & Southeast Asian Studies, Business Management, Law, etc.), providing them with the opportunity to obtain insight into Korean culture, current affairs, and history, as well prepare them for interaction with Korean speaking society, which will continue to be the powerful thriving Asian force in the 21st century.

# 2. Electives (15 credits from Category 1/2 credit units)

## Part III Additional Information

Under the new structure, the total credit units required in the Korean minor programme will be increased to <u>18 credit units</u>.

In order to accommodate academic needs of students while maintaining high quality of Korean minor progamme, students are divided into two categories depending on their prior knowledge in Korean language: Category 1 (CAT.1) and Category 2(CAT.2). Thus, normal entry is Category 1. But in special cases (see the description below), entry can be at Category 2.

1. Students who do not have previous knowledge in Korean should take five Korean Language Skills Courses (15 credit units) in CAT.1 as well as one core course (3 credits) to fulfill the Korean minor requirement.

 $\rightarrow$  15 credits (CAT.1) + 3 credits (Core course)

- 2. Students who previously have studied Korean language courses, they can skip UP TO 9 credit units in CAT.1 by taking the courses as listed in CAT.2 as well as one core course (3 credits) to complete the 18-credits requirements.  $\rightarrow$ 6 credits (CAT.1) + 9 credits (CAT.2) + 3 credits (Core course)
- 3. Students who already have equivalent language proficiency level of CTL3982 Intermediate Korean I or pass the placement test by course examiner can skip UP TO 15 credit units in CAT.1 by taking the courses as listed in CAT.2 as well as one core course (3 credits) to complete the 18-credits requirements.
