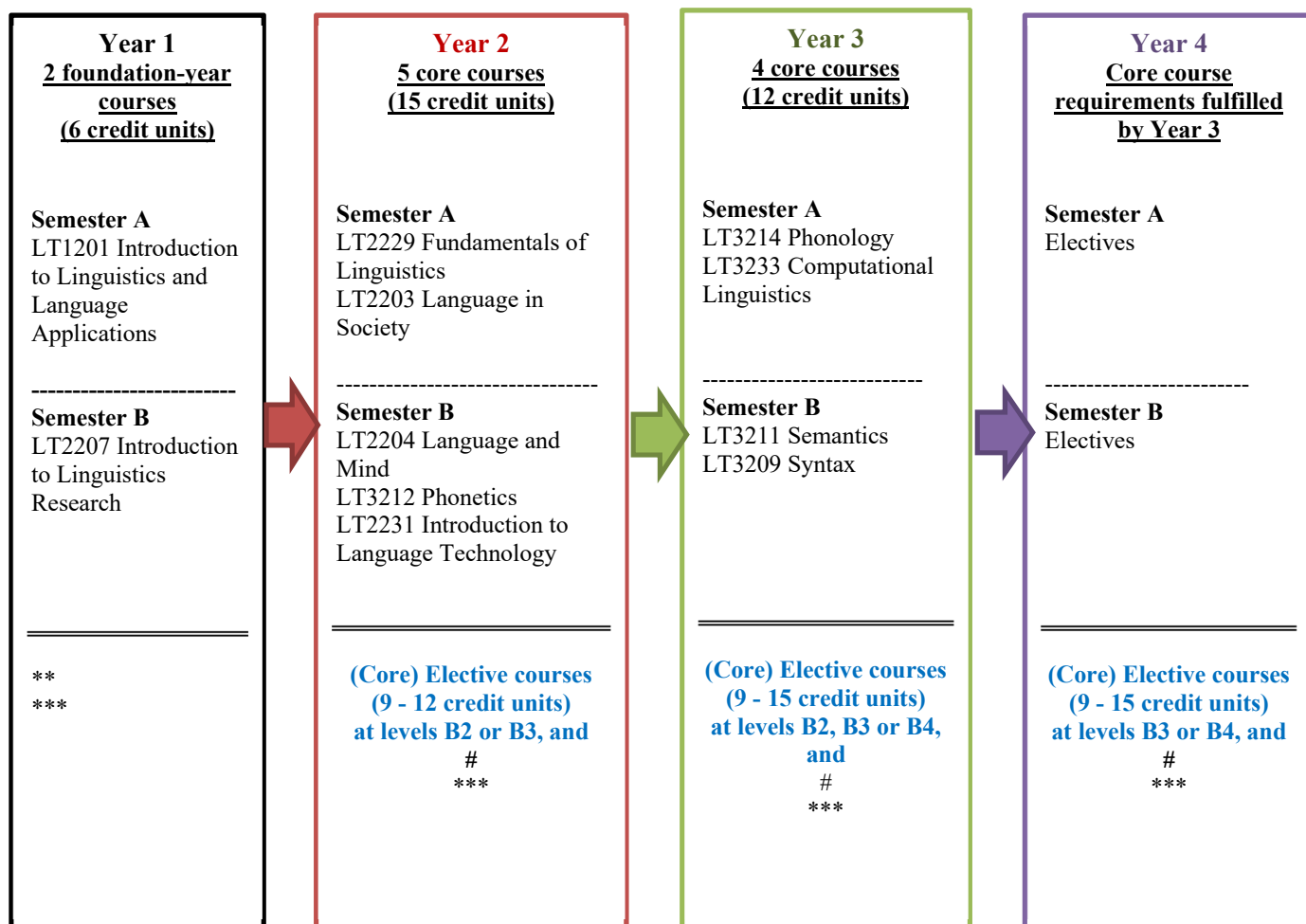
## Study Plan of BA in Linguistics and Language Applications Cohort 2022 Second Year of Four-Year Curriculum (BAU4)

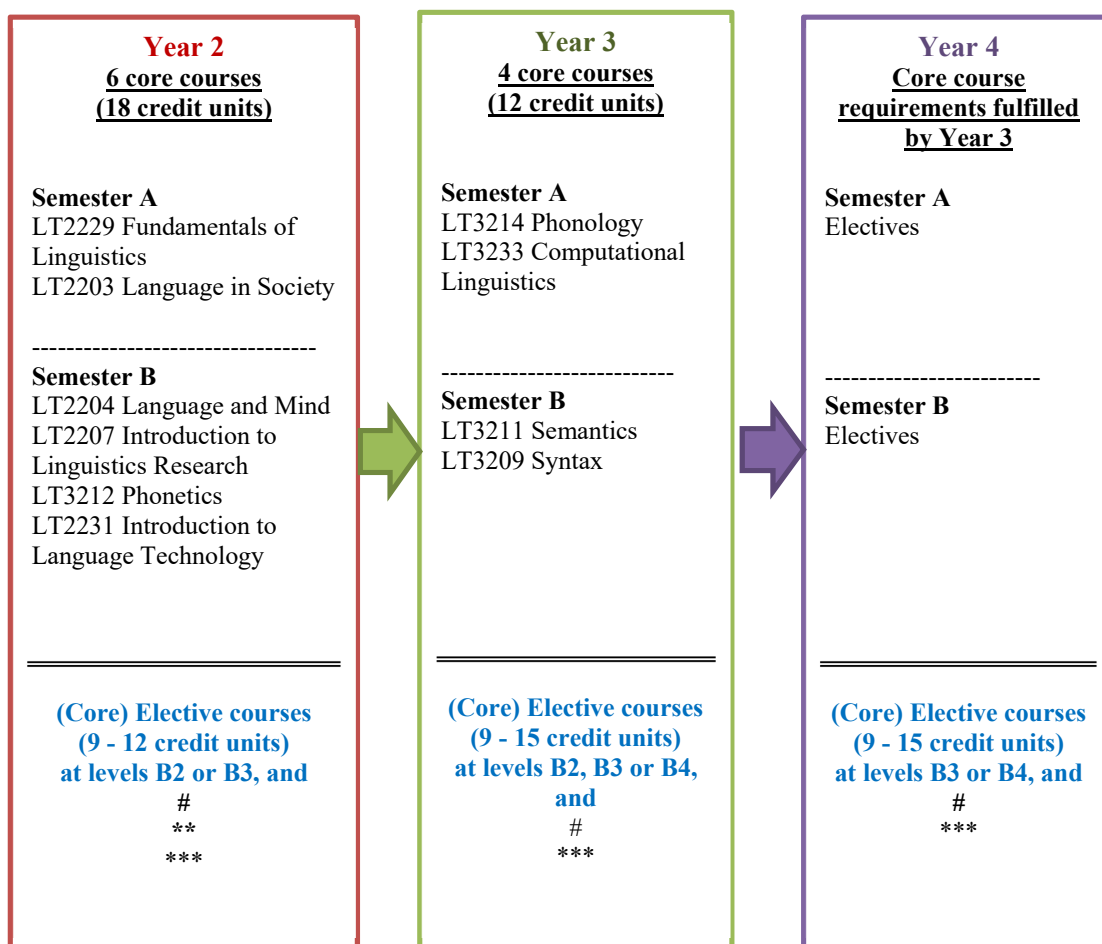

## Notes

1. This is a suggested study plan only and is subject to change.
2. In addition to the two foundation-year courses (6 credit units), normative 4-year degree students are also expected to complete the College requirement courses (2 courses/ 6 credit units) and some University requirement and Gateway Education requirement courses in their first year of studies. For an overview of degree requirements, please refer to page 1 of this document and DegreeWorks.
3. Students must take at least one and at most two of the core elective courses in order to graduate: LT3199 Professional Internship I (3 credits), LT4235 Project (3 credits), LT4391 Undergraduate Research Project (6 credits).
4. Under normal circumstances, Year 2 students can take elective courses at levels B2 and B3. Year 3 students can take elective courses at levels B2, B3 and B4 while Year 4 students can only take elective courses at levels B3 and B4.
5. All students are required to take at least 4 major electives (12 credit units) at B4 level for graduation.
6. Do not change the courses pre-registered unnecessarily since they are offered once a year only. Registration priority for B4 courses will be given to the graduating students first and other cohorts later and so be patient and wait for your turn.
7. Some elective courses, e.g., B4 level courses, are offered every other year, so plan ahead. For details of the course offering schedule, please contact your Major Leader.
