

# Dining Information for Conference Participants

## Lunch Options

Participants are free to arrange their own lunches during the conference. Two convenient options are available nearby — our on-campus catering facilities and the [Festival Walk](#) shopping mall, both easily accessible from the conference venue.

### On-Campus Dining — CityUHK Catering Outlets

The most affordable and convenient choice is right on campus. CityUHK operates several catering hubs offering a wide range of local and international dishes, with a standard set lunch typically costing between **HK\$28 and HK\$45**.

The two main canteens are City Express (5/F, Bank of China Complex) and AC2 Canteen (3/F, Li Dak Sum Yip Yio Chin Building), both serving rice sets, noodle combos, and local favourites from around HK\$28–HK\$40. For lighter bites, AC3 Café and CMCAFE offer sandwiches, paninis, and noodle bowls from HK\$35–HK\$50. The AC3 Bistro (7/F, Lau Ming Wai Academic Building) features a charge-by-the-weight Chinese lunch buffet, while Lodge Bistro caters to western preferences with lunch sets at about HK\$200.

### Festival Walk — Food Fest (Top Floor)

Alternatively, Festival Walk is just a short walk across the suspension bridge from campus. The mall's top-floor food court, Food Fest, hosts a variety of stalls including popular options such as Café de Coral and Pepper Lunch. A standard combo set meal generally costs between **HK\$50 and HK\$80**, with budget roasted meat and luncheon meat sets available from around HK\$45–HK\$60. Premium options such as Japanese set meals and specialty regional cuisine are also available, typically priced between HK\$85–HK\$120. The mall also features full-service restaurants on other floors at higher price points.
