3. Mode

Full-time, 4 years for normative four-year degree students.

4. Commencement

Semester A, 2021-2022.

CityU students of the 2019 entry will commence their 3rd year of study at NTU in 2021/22.

5. Admission Requirements

The programme is open to full-time normative four-year programme students in selected majors who:

- a. will have completed at least 60 credit units in their first two years of study at home institution before commencing their study at host institution. Completed credits must include courses specified by the respective College and department for the first two years' curriculum.
- b. have a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.30 or above.
- c. have good English language proficiency.
- d. meet all the admission requirements of the host institution.

6. Curriculum Design

Courses taken at both institutions will be mutually recognised and used to fulfil the curriculum requirement of both institutions based on the course mapping

By the end of four years of study, students will be awarded two graduation certificates: one conferred by CityU and one by NTU upon fulfilling the degree requirements stipulated by both universities.

7. Financial Arrangement

CityU and NTU students under this joint programme will pay tuition fee to the home institution irrespective of their study location.

Eligible students may apply for scholarships at both institutions on their own.

3. Mode

Full-time, 4 years for normative four-year degree students admitted in Sept 2020 and thereafter.

4. Commencement

September 2022/23

CityU students will commence their 3rd year (for the 2020/21 entry) of study at Columbia University.

5. Admission Requirements

Standard requirements set by CityU:

- a) Have completed at least 60 credits at the home university;
- b) Have an excellent academic record, with a CGPA of 3.3 or above; and
- c) Meet all the admission or specific requirements stipulated by CityU and Columbia U.

Students will be nominated by LT, City University of Hong Kong. Columbia U will review the nominations and make the final decision on admission.

6. Curriculum Design

Students will spend their first two years at City University of Hong Kong and stay at Columbia University for their third and fourth years.

Courses taken at Columbia U can be used to fulfil the curriculum requirement of CityU.
